Divisional Play Philosophy

SHETLAND

Your Children's introduction to organized baseball begins here! The Shetland Division is a purely instructional, non-competitive division. It uses a combination of T-ball and coach pitching and emphasizes teaching the basic rules and fundamental skills of baseball. We believe in developing an environment of friendly competition with little emphasis on winning -- no scoring or stats are kept. All players will play the entire game, even if all players are present.

PINTO

In the Pinto division the name of the game is FUNdamentals. Young players learn the basics of the game at this level in an organized but fun and forgiving setting. Batters have the opportunity to hit off live player and coach pitching, but also have the opportunity to hit off the tee during the first half of the season to insure success at almost every at bat. Players at this level are expected to hustle, play their best and have FUN in a safe and learning environment. Teamwork, respect for the volunteer coaching staff and good sportsmanship is expected from the players and parents to insure a positive learning environment to help the players develop their baseball and life skills to the best of their ability.

MUSTANG

The Mustang Division players make a big step towards a more complete level of baseball. It is a competitive division, where umpires call the game and scores and league standings are kept. The bases are 60 feet apart and the pitchers mound is 44 feet from the plate with pitching being done strictly by players only. Players are allowed to steal 2nd and 3rd bases the entire season. During the first four games runners may not lead off of first or second until the pitch crosses home plate. After the first four games of the season lead-offs are allowed from 1st and 2nd base. For safety reasons, no leadoffs are allowed from third base until the ball crosses the plate until the last two games of the season. After the first four games, pitchers learn to hold runners on base and to do pickoff moves. Balks are also called on pitchers. The infield fly rule will be enforced and the dropped third strike rules will be enforced for the last two games of the season and during the playoffs. At the end of the regular season a double elimination tournament is held with all teams participating. Just as in the Major Leagues, separate League Championship Series are played with awards for both teams in each League Championship. All Divisions, including Mustang, participate in a City Championship game on a league wide City Championship day. Commemorative awards are given to the Mustang City Champion.



BRONCO

The Bronco Division is where you begin to play more competitive baseball and follow the rules of Major League Baseball closely. Players are allowed to lead-off and steal from all bases, and the diamond is now 70 feet. Managers have the opportunity to execute the finer tactics of advanced baseball. It is a competitive Division, where umpires are used and league standings are kept. At the end of the regular season an overall Bronco Division Tournament is held where all teams participate.

PONY

The Pony Division is a competitive division best characterized by fewer players, fewer teams, bigger fields, and bigger players. By now the players should have an understanding of the rules of the game and acquired the skills and attitude necessary for a more competitive game of baseball. Regular Major League rules are used. The diamond is now 80 feet. Emphasis is placed not only on individual skill development, but, also on team strategies. Players will adjust to larger fields, stronger defenses, and more experienced pitchers and are motivated by their eagerness to play baseball. At the end of the regular season, an overall Pony Division champion is determined in a tournament where all teams participate.

COLT

The Colt division begins play in mid-May. Because many of the players are involved in high school baseball programs, this division begins games after the high school season ends. Players aged 15 and 16 play seven innings games on a regulation major league sized field. If four or more teams are fielded then the Colt Division play among themselves in games at Live Oak High School in Morgan Hill. If fewer than four teams are fielded, then the teams usually play a home and travel schedule as part of a San Jose league.

Rules Changes for Managers & Coaches Rules for Coaches and Managers regarding clinics and workshops

Rule 9.A.3 – All managers and coaches will be required to complete the following: Coaches Clinic-PCA (every year); First Aid (every two years, or have an unexpired First Aid Card); Skills & Drills Clinic (every year), Scorekeeping Clinic (Mustang thru Pony only – once); Coaches Application (every year).

Rule 9.A.3.a – Failure to comply with the above will result in the manager and/or coach being suspended for the first two games of the season; and dropping to a reserve role for any All-Star coaching positions. If both the manager and coach are in violation of the above, the coach will be allowed to manage the team until the manager has completed his/her suspension, then will serve his/her suspension except Shetland.

Coach Skills is a “Skills & Drills” class

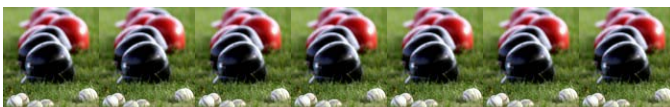
Positive Coaching Alliance (PCA) - coaching workshop is a mandatory class for all managers & coaches. New coaches should try to attend the Coach level 1 workshop. For coaches who attended the PCA Coach Level 1 workshop last year, plans to attend one of the Coaches level 2 workshops this year. If you can't make the appropriate workshop, then attend any one of the three coach workshops to satisfy your PCA coaching workshop requirement.

Positive Coaching Alliance Parent Workshop Scheduled for March 21st

MHPB joined the Positive Coaching Alliance last year. The PCA is working with youth sports organizations to promote positive coaching and parent behavior during practices and games. One of the major goals of PCA is to try to find ways to make youth sports more positive and fun for the players.

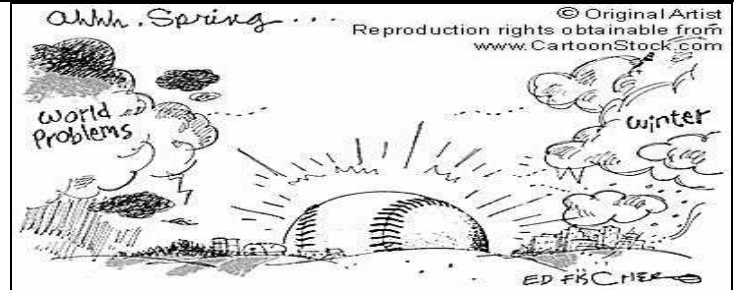
The PCA Parent Workshop will be held on Wed March 21st from 7:30 – 9:30 pm in the Performing Arts Center at Sobrato High School. We invite all MHPB parents to come to the parent workshop.

Drawing from principles of The Double-Goal Coach, this workshop teaches attendees how to become “Second-Goal” parents by focusing on the second goal of a Double-Goal Coach, teaching life lessons through sports. The three major principles of the Double-Goal Coach workshop are introduced to provide context and then applied to a parent’s role in youth sports.

The workshop begins by asking parents what their goals are for their youth athletes, which often produces spirited discussions. Attendees then participate in interactive exercises that cultivate the supportive behavior that helps youth athletes thrive.

Keep those Young Arms Strong & Conditioned

As we enter another baseball campaign with tryouts, practices and games, a common denominator seems to pop up with a lot of individual players. Coaches sometimes don't know about it and in all likelihood parents don't find out either. I'm talking about the pre-season sore arm.

Players tend to do too much too soon and haven't conditioned their arm before tryouts or practices begin. They might be coming right out of basketball or some other sport and haven't found the time to strengthen their arm. So, in time, they incur a sore arm. And it lingers for days, sometime weeks. Parents try ice, then heat, rest or throwing a short distance. These are good band aids but won't help in the long run.

When players begin their shoulders are weak and their arms unconditioned. Beginning with arm circles is a good place to start. In keeping with Taylor Made Baseball and the Jaeger Sports Thrive on Throwing program, players should start with small arm circles with their palms down, progress to 1/2 arm circles. 3/4 and then full, back down to 3/4, 1/2 and finish with little ones. All these should be done

Then, turn your palms up and do the same, this time going backwards, for a total of 112 more.

At first the player's shoulders will be burning but with workouts 2 or 3 times per week the burning will subside and the shoulders will become stronger and conditioned. These should be done before every practice and game. Next comes long toss. Youth players should start playing catch at 40 or 50 feet and work their way back to as far as they can throw, no matter what level they play on. I realize younger players on the Pinto and Mustang level may not be able to be as accurate but stretching out the distance is critical in gaining arm strength. The old theory of playing short and staying short is outdated. Just go to a pro game and watch players warm up, especially pitchers. You'll soon find out they play long toss.

As the season progresses the more long toss a player does the stronger and more conditioned his arm becomes. This is especially good for pitchers. No pitcher should be saying he has a sore arm come June if he's properly conditioned his arm all season long.

And last, are the J-Band workouts. I'll be showing coaches and parents at clinics this season how the surgical tubing works and the benefits it provides. I'm hoping every team and manager will have one available for their team this season. Put all these things together and you have the formula for a season with no arm soreness, no pain and a healthier arm once playoff and All-Star time arrive.
